Our Purpose

The Kenora and Lake of the Woods Regional Community Foundation is a proud member of Community Foundations of Canada. In 2023, Community Foundations of Canada had 206-member Community Foundations across Canada with \$7.4 billion in assets and grant distributions of \$112 million.

Gail Konantz Art Education Fund

Gail Konantz (1936-2018) was a painter and longtime lake resident on Lake of the Woods. She was a creative force — a "Gailforce," as her family called her — who earned her Masters of Fine Arts from the University of Manitoba. She worked at the Winnipeg Art Gallery and as an art educator in both private and public-school systems.

To honour and extend the influence of Gail's joy and creativity, friends and family have established the Gail Konantz Art Education Fund to support visual arts education for youth and adults at the Douglas Family Art Centre. The endowment fund will provide material support for art projects, classes and activities to inspire and encourage the artist in each of us, something that was close to Gail's heart.

At the official reception for the Fund, held at the Art Centre on July 23, 2022, Gail's family stated that "she is now the spiritual artist in residence of the Art Centre'" They also announced that friends had come together to maximize each dollar raised for the fund, by a four to one ratio. By the end of the reception, the fund had grown to over \$100,000. The Gail Konantz Art Education Endowment Fund will ensure that her positive creative influence will continue in perpetuity. Lori Nelson Legacy Fund

As a community builder in the Lake of the Woods Region, few individuals can match the achievements of Lori Nelson. When Lori retired after thirty-four years of service as Director of the Lake of the Woods Museum and The Douglas Family Art Centre, now known collectively as the Muse, her colleagues, friends, and family members, established the Lori Nelson Legacy Fund at the Community Foundation.

Lori's Fund was created in the fall of 2023 to help support emerging museum and art gallery professionals as they enter their respective fields. Proceeds from the Fund will support special projects such as: art and historical exhibitions; community education programming; guest presentations; and archival and preventative conservation projects. The goal is simple: to empower up-and-coming cultural workers to make a positive and lasting difference in their community, that is to say, to create a new generation of "Lori Nelsons".

Lori was further recognized for her outstanding work, by being awarded the Ontario Museum Association Distinguished Career Award of Excellence on October 27, 2023. Throughout her career, Lori has been a forward-thinking leader in the museum sector and her work has been recognized regionally, provincially and nationally. She was also responsible for the fundraising project which created the Douglas Family Art Centre in 2019. As Museum Director, Lori supported the hosting of our annual Festival of Trees Charity fundraiser in that magical venue, for over a decade. In addition, Lori served on our Board of Directors from 2014 to 2021. Thank you, Lori, for your community building efforts and best wishes on your retirement.

In the winter of 2023, our Community Foundation was proud to be one of the participating community foundations across Canada, taking part in the Government of Canada's Community Services Recovery Fund, a collaboration between the Canadian Red Cross, Community Foundations of Canada, and United Way Centraide Canada. Locally, Mount Evergreen Ski Hill, the Kenora Association for Community Living, Kenora District New Horizons, Kenora Chiefs Advisory Inc., Knox United Church and Tikinagan Family Services shared a total of \$317,000 in grant support.

Kenora Supports Ukraine



On April 21, 2022, in a show of solidarity with the people of the Ukraine, dozens of Kenora individuals came together to form a volunteer group named "Kenora Supports Ukraine" (KSU). Their mission was to assist Ukrainian refuges in settling and transitioning to life in Kenora. KSU set an initial ambitious \$75,000 fundraising target.

They encouraged local community members and businesses to lend a hand, in helping to provide financial assistance in healthcare, employment, education and housing for those looking to relocate to Kenora. St Alban's Cathedral was instrumental in helping to process all the community donations. A leadership gift of \$25,000 was the first contribution received from Bart and Linda Stevenson, of Forest Helicopters.

The Community Foundation also assisted KSU's efforts by creating a flow through fund and inviting their donors to make contributions. Community Foundation Executive Director Tara Douglas said "This is a hugely impactful initiative in our area during a troubling time in the world. Introducing this fund really showcases our Community Foundation's mission to improve the quality of life for citizens and visitors to our region."

Choosing Where to Give

Community Fund

This fund is not tied to a specific charity or area of interest. This allows the Community Foundation to respond to the immediate and changing needs of the community.

Field of Interest Fund

Allows the donor to designate a specific area of interest from which charitable grants can be made, including the following categories: Arts & Culture, Health & Wellness, Social Services, Animal Welfare, Community at Large, or the Environment.

Designated Fund

Gives donors the opportunity to specify which charity will receive their long-term support.

Donor Advised Fund

Enables donors to have ongoing participation in the selection of charities that will benefit from their gift.

Charitable Agency Endowment Fund

Donors can contribute to any of the Agency Endowment funds established by registered charities.

Memorial Fund

Can be established in the form of any of the above listed fund types, in memory of a family or individual. Grants from these funds are tailored to each donor's wishes.

Funds Held For Others

A registered charity entrusts the Community Foundation with a portion of their assets, while the charity retains the ownership of the assets.

The Community Foundation considers grant applications made by charitable organizations that fall into the following categories: Arts and Culture, Health and Wellness, Social Welfare, Animal Welfare, the Environment and the Community at large. Only registered charities in good standing with CRA, offering programs benefiting residents and visitors in the Kenora and Lake of the Woods Region, are eligible to apply.

Charitable Agency Endowment Funds

Kenora Association for Community Living

Contributions to this fund will help the Association achieve its goal of ensuring that all people with special needs have the opportunity to live meaningful and satisfying lifestyles as equals in their community.

City Of Kenora Public Library

Will allow friends of the Kenora Public Library to make a meaningful contribution to its future.

Triple PLAY

Offers donors the opportunity to make a lasting gift to the TRIPLE PLAY, a program of FIREFLY. Triple PLAY allows sports, recreation and arts and culture activities to be accessible to all children in the Kenora and Lake of the Woods Region.

Pinecrest Home for the Aged

Enables donors to make endowment contributions in support of the Kenora and District Home for the Aged (Pinecrest Home). The investment from the fund will be used by Pinecrest to support their programs.

Kenora Special Olympics

Contributions to this fund will hep to ensure that the best possible sports training, competitions and programs are available for athletes with intellectual challenges.

Kenora Handi Transit

Offers donors the opportunity to make a lasting gift to a much-valued program. This service provides a lifeline to physically or developmentally challenged individuals in need of transportation.

Women's Shelter Saakate House

Contributions to this fund will help provide safe and secure accommodations for abused women and children transitioning to safe living conditions.

This fund offers donors the opportunity to assist financially challenged families in accessing a variety of healthy food programs.

FIREFLY

Allows donors to support program relating to child and youth mental health services as well as an array of community services that support children and their families. Anyone can contribute to this fund.

Building Up Our Community



A 2021 grant to the Sioux Narrows Arts Festival helped the group present a variety of musical, dance and dramatic performances during the summer. Their goal was to support and promote emerging, local and professional regional musicians and dancers, for everyone to experience and enjoy.



October 2023 saw the official opening of the Rotary Peace Park and the monument honouring Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women, Girls, Trans and 2 Spirit individuals on the shores of beautiful Lake of the Woods. The Kenora Rotary Club took a lead role in creating this quiet place for reflection and a gathering place for ceremonies.

A Community Services Recovery Fund grant of \$99,752 allowed the Kenora Association for Community Living to implement a modern approach to virtual learning and the creation of a multifunctional, learning space with updated technology.

Building Up Our Community



A 2023 grant from the Community Foundation and The Richardson Family, enabled a Young Moms Program to provide a safe, stable, affordable housing program for young mothers (aged 16-29) and their child(ren) under the age of four years. The program, offered through Women's Shelter Saakate House, is an opportunity to live free of violence and substance abuse. This program could last up to two years in length and is targeted to young moms who are looking to promote attachment and further connection or reunification with their children.



Staff members Gloria and Darlene from the Salvation Army in Kenora, received a grant from the Community Foundation for supporting local students with warm winter clothing and nutritious fruit and vegetables. In addition, they provide a community food pantry to those in need and a wonderful thrift store in the heart of downtown Kenora. They began operating in Kenora in 1936.



A \$5,000 Community Needs Grant was presented to Mary Bawden and her team at St Alban's Cathedral, for providing nutritious suppers for those in need, through their Friday Night Food for Friends program. Household food insecurity is a prevalent and ongoing public health concern in Canada, including northwestern Ontario. More than 1 in 5(21.3%) households in the Kenora-Rainy River Districts are facing food insecurity, higher than estimates for both the province(18.7%) and the Northwest region (19.2%).



Every year, Triple PLAY hosts a variety of outdoor events for youth and their families, including BBQ's at Garrow Park, featuring fun sporting events for all ages, art and crafts demonstrations and musical sing alongs. Triple Play allows sports, recreation and arts and culture activities to be accessible to all children in the Kenora and Lake of the Woods Region.






Assets Under Management
